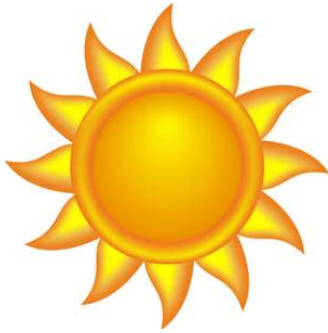

The Importance of the 3-Points of Contact Rule

Something as simple as getting in and out of your truck can pose a serious threat to your safety. Avoid taking the easy way in and out of your cab by adhering to the 3-points of contact rule!

- Keep at least 3 limbs in contact with the vehicle at all times.
- Always enter and exit facing the cab.
- Never jump from the truck.
- Always check the ground before exiting and look for uneven surfaces.

Take your health and safety seriously! Follow the 3 Point Rule and avoid an injury.
